Fawn Hill Farm, the site of the 15th Mansion in May Designer Showhouse and Gardens, is located in Harding Township, New Jersey. The 34-acre estate was originally called Graymar Farm and dates back to 1937. The initial owner, Allan Kirby, president of Alleghany Corporation, and his wife Marian purchased part of a large farm when relocating their family from Pennsylvania. The estate remained in the Kirby family until 1980. It was acquired by its present owners a few years later and renamed Fawn Hill Farm. The estate has been greatly enhanced through restoration of the 21-room three-story English-style stone manor house which has sweeping views of the surrounding countryside. The manor house is in the classic style constructed using concrete and steel beams with a thick slate roof and colonnaded rear terrace similar to George Washington's Mount Vernon home. The manor boasts extensive moldings, pegged hardwood flooring, seven distinctive fireplaces, seven bedrooms and a stately wainscoted foyer with a graceful Georgian staircase leading to the second-floor gallery.

Fawn Hill Farm is one of the largest intact estates in the New Jersey/New York area and encompasses beautiful pastures, ponds, a stable, and barns and adjoins miles of equestrian trails. Over fifty local designers and landscape artists contributed to the 2010 Mansion in May, which displays thirty-five designer show rooms along with sixteen formal gardens and landscape design areas. Guests may also visit a shopping boutique which offers a selection of unique local vendors with special gift, decorating and entertaining accessories.

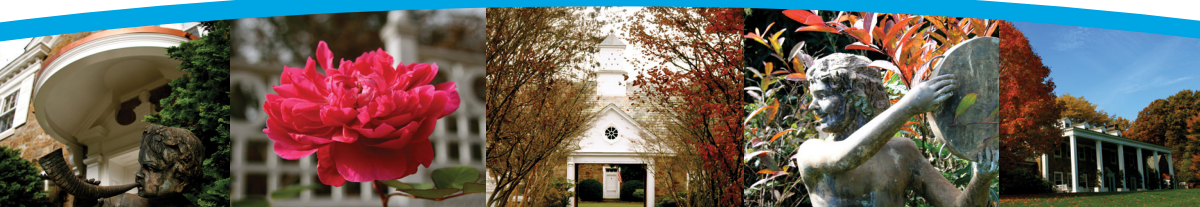

DIRECTIONS TO MANSION IN MAY PARKING

Parking is located at 475 South Street, Morristown, NJ 07960.
Shuttle service is provided from the parking lot to the mansion.

OUT OF MORRISTOWN:

Head south on South Street, passing the entrance to I-287, then continue for 0.7 miles to 475 South Street corporate office driveway on the right. Go past office building and then turn left into rear parking lot. Park near the gazebo labeled Mansion in May Shuttle where shuttle vans will be waiting to take you to Fawn Hill Farm.

FROM NJ-124 EAST:

Take Tempe Wick Road/CR-646 East in Mendham (at US Post Office) 1.7 miles to traffic light. Cross over Route 202 onto Glen Alpine Road; go 1.5 miles to next traffic light. Turn left onto Blue Mill Road. Continue 2.5 miles to blinking light. Turn left onto Spring Valley Road. Go 1.6 miles to a slight right on to South Street. After 0.2 miles turn left into 475 South Street office driveway. Park near the gazebo labeled Mansion in May Shuttle where shuttle vans will be waiting to take you to Fawn Hill Farm.

FROM I-287 NORTH:

Take Exit 35 – Route 124/South St./Madison Ave. Turn right at end of ramp onto South Street. Continue as above from Morristown.

FROM I-287 SOUTH:

Take Exit 35 – Route 124 Madison Ave West ramp. Turn right at end of ramp. Get into left lane. At next light turn sharp left onto South Street. Continue as above from Morristown.

FROM I-78 EAST OR WEST:

Take Exit 29 to merge onto I-287 North. Continue as above from I-287 North.

FROM US ROUTE 202 NORTH:

About 2 miles north of the Old Mill Inn in Bernardsville, turn right at Tempe Wick/Glen Alpine traffic light. Follow directions for NJ-124 East.

FROM NEW YORK CITY:

Take I-78 West to NJ-24 West, via Exit 48 towards I-287 (Springfield Township/Morristown). After about 6 miles, take exit for I-287 South and follow directions From I-287 South.
