As chief of staff, Nielsen was responsible for the Romney Administration's policy and legislative initiatives and for overseeing the daily operations of the state government.

In his own right, Nielsen was elected to the Connecticut House of Representatives in 1992 and to two terms in the state Senate in 1994 and 1996, representing the greater Danbury area. He currently resides in Ridgefield.
