Day Pitney Recognizes Four Attorneys for Outstanding Pro Bono Service

(HARTFORD, January 18, 2013)—Day Pitney LLP presented four attorneys with the 2012 Coleman Awards in recognition of their exemplary pro bono work in their communities.

Shiroma recently became a law clerk to Day Pitney former partner Michael Shea, who was appointed to the federal bench in Connecticut in December.
